CFUW BURLINGTON ADVOCACY COMMITTEE

PROPOSED TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. The Advocacy Committee ('the Committee') along with the other permanent Committees supports the President in executing the **CFUW Mission Statement** as follows:
 - the pursuit of knowledge
 - the promotion of education
 - the improvement of the status of women and human rights and
 - active participation in public affairs in the spirit of co-operation and friendship
- 2. The Committee is also responsible for carrying out the purpose of the CFUW Burlington Chapter pertaining specifically to the following clauses in **Article II** of the Constitution:
 - To assist in developing a sound concept of educational values and in maintaining high standards of public education in Canada; to promote higher education of women; to encourage continuing education through the granting of scholarships.
 - 2. To foster a sense of responsibility and encourage university women to place their education and professional training at the service of the community.
 - 3. To create and sustain among members an intelligent interest in public affairs in the political, social and cultural fields; to encourage an active participation in such affairs by qualified women; and to provide an opportunity for effective concerned action.

 - 5. To participate in the work of the Canadian Federation of University Women and the International Federation of University Women.
- 3. The function of the Advocacy Committee is to increase awareness of and respond to social issues based on CFUW policy with effective action by:
 - a. Enabling and maintaining ongoing communications with the Board of Education and Trustees, and with City and regional councils:
 - b. Writing letters to local MP and MPP(s) on women's issues related to the resolutions passed at the AGM on healthcare, housing, human rights, peace and security, etc.;
 - c. Sending delegations from the Club to meet with local representatives as follow-up to correspondence;
 - d. Writing letters to the editors of local newspapers on issues of public concern; and
 - e. Sponsoring all candidates meetings prior to elections.

- 4. It is recommended that the membership on the Committee be comprised of the following:
 - a. President (ex officio)
 - b. Past President
 - c. Vice-President
 - d. Representatives of Ontario Council CFUW Standing Committees:
 - a. Education
 - b. Legislation
 - c. Status of Women
 - e. Other members by invitation of the Chair
- 5. The Committee will select a Chairperson and Secretary who will hold the position for one year. These positions may be extended upon the agreement of the Committee members.
- 6. The Committee is a permanent committee of the CFUW Burlington Chapter and meets each month or at the call of the Chair.
- 7. The Chair of the Committee or designee is a member of the Executive Committee.
